#### **About FERPA Waiver**

We'd like to notify you about your rights to information relating to your college applications, and we'll need you to answer a question before you proceed. When you apply to college, your application file typically includes information considered to be confidential, such as letters of recommendation and notes made by college admissions officers. Under regulation known as the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, you might obtain the right to access some of this information. These rights only apply to documents held by the college you attend, so it is unlikely you will have a need to see them. Colleges prefer to know that the information they compile in your application file will remain confidential, so we are asking you to sign the following "waiver" to give them this assurance.




