# **Scoir + Common App Integration**

On the fence about leveraging the Common App Integration? We hear you! Ultimately, our goal is to make sure you have the information you need to make the best decision for your school whether that's opting in, or out.

# How it works

#### **Connecting Accounts**

Students will be prompted to connect Scoir and their Common App accounts by logging in at the touch points we provide.

### **College List Syncing**

Once connected, your students' My Colleges lists will sync with their Common App activity. You'll know where they've applied and when they've applied, all within Scoir.

#### **Preparing and Sending Counselor Forms**

Students will complete their FERPA release & waiver, make Fee Waiver requests, and complete their portion of Early Decision Agreements in Common App for those colleges they're applying via Common App.

Counselors will finalize their portion of shared forms, as well as build and send all other required forms entirely in Scoir. When submitting forms, they will be routed through Common App, which will then send it to the college for a consistent delivery experience.

#### **Managing Teacher Recommendations**

You still have control over how teacher recommendations flow and Common App will no longer prompt students to request teacher evaluations and recommendations, so you can say goodbye to duplicate recommendation requests.

## **Benefits**

- A more streamlined process with fewer steps for students
- No more conflicting instructions about how and where to request recommendations, helping reduce confusion and preventing duplicate recommendation requests
- Application materials are collected and delivered in a consistent manner to colleges
- Better visibility into the student application journey when they apply via Common App

## **Considerations**

- You'll no longer be able to upload Letters of Recommendation on behalf of teachers for Common App colleges
- Teachers will need to complete their profile and evaluation questions when completing letters of recommendation. There will also be an optional student ratings section.
- You won't have the ability to tailor documents to specific schools or limit which ones are sent
- When students use Common App as their application method, the one & done nature of Common App will be enacted. The one exception is teacher recommendations. Students (or counselors depending on your settings) will assign teachers' letters to particular colleges, based on a college's LOR requirements.
